5. BRIAN MOORE'S TALK.

Brian spoke about cooler growing conditions and his experiences growing orchids in Dorrigo. Brian is an excellent grower and he talked with us about his efforts to use coco chip instead of bark in his potting mix. He gave some recipes as follows:

RECIPE FOR TREATING COCO CHIP POTTING MIX

- Break up and soak bale for 24 hours in fresh water.
- Drain and dry and then re-soak in new water with the following chemicals
- 100g magnesium sulphate
- 100g iron sulphate
- 100g caltrate
- When dry add 10% coarse perlite to the chip mixture
- Then add a small amount of fine zeolite mineral.

ORGANIC FEEDERS

- Seasol concentrate
- Powerfeed concentrate as per instructions

SPRAY FOR SCALE

- 1ml Rogor
- 4ml white oil
- 2ml chemspray

Add this to 1L of water. This is also effective on red spider. Make sure you cover up with gloves and a mask.

6. SHOW

Our Spring Show is fast approaching. We will be setting up our hall from 3 pm on Friday 13th September and the Show will be held on Saturday and Sunsday, 14th and 15th September.

It is also well worth a look at some of the native orchids in bloom in the gardens at this time, especially the Phaius, or swamp orchids. The Phaius australis in native to this area and the Botanic Gardens has a good display of these orchids.

We need help to organise and run the Show and a roster will be passed around at the next meeting, with a completed roster included as part of the September newsletter.

7. LIGHTING

Lighting in the car park has been a concern for some time. It can be very dark, and it is a safety problem. We have made a couple of phone calls, and we have written a letter to Council about this. We are hopeful that it will be fixed by our next meeting.

However it might be a good idea to bring a torch in case the repairs aren't completed by then.
