5. GROWING COELOGYNES

Ed Pearce spoke on Coelogyne orchids. Things have developed since his father hybridised and registered his Coelogyne Edward Pearce (mooreana x fragrans. Ed had two Coelogyne plants on display. Explaining they grow quite well in Coffs Harbour but not as well as Norm Mitchell who grew big specimens. Coelogyne tomentosa is a big plant with lots of flowers. He received his first one from Ken Green and it grows very quickly. Displaying is difficult with their arching flower spikes so he purchased the stand on show from K-Mart for \$7.

Coelogyne orchids are found in South East Asia and the Pacific Islands (warmer growing orchids found at sea level) and the Himalayas (cooler growing orchids found in the mountains).

Mooreana, a cooler growing orchid grows well at Bellingen and Dorrigo and places like Melbourne, but does OK in Coffs Harbour

Ed followed up with information about Coelogyne cristata, a cooler growing orchid with its orange and yellow lip with white flowers, which also does OK in Coffs. Gary Suter has 3 different varieties. His Coelogyne speciosa, a commonly grown orchid, has flowered continuously for the last 2 years.

Norm Mitchell who passed away 3 years ago, often won awards with his huge Coelogyne fimbriata at our show.

Ed also spoke about Coelogyne pandurata which he tried to grow when he started growing orchids in Victoria. Ed's father Ron stated it was too cold in Victoria to grow Pandurata, and he was right. Larry Thornton got a plant for Ed – green flower, black throat – when he came to Coffs Harbour. There is a lot of controversy over this particular orchid with people saying the plants labelled pandurata in Australia are really a hybrid Coelogyne Burfordiense.

Steve Clemesha remarked someone gave him a green fragrans but it is brown. There are quite a few different

species of Coelogyne. They display lots of flowers which are in bloom for quite a long time.

Ed spoke about growing this particular type of orchid, watering and fertilising at pretty much the same as other orchids, although it's better not to repot them too often. Positioning can be difficult. Potting mix consists of coco fibre, purlite and bark. Barb asked where she can purchase the potting mix, to which Ed replied Tinonee Orchids or Easy Orchids. The coco fibre comes in a block. Big W used to sell it. Ed uses an old wheel barrow with holes in it and washes through dolomite. Some people swear by it while others swear at it, he said. Di Blay says it stays too wet and cold in winter.

Coelogyne orchids are relatively easy, productive and rewarding to grow and are not subject to insect pests.

There are very few hybrids compared with other orchids – with only around 60 being produced. Mooreana and speciosa are used a lot in hybridising. Ed explained his father Ron's frustration on crossing a plant (Linda Buckley - mooreana x cristata) which took 7 years to flower and when it came to registering the cross someone beat him by 6 weeks.

One of the best sites on the Web for information is Kevin Dawes of Canberra who is involved in hybridising, naming his plants Kirribilli which is known world-wide. The site is coelogynes.com

However, be very cautious when googling information about orchids as you must know what region in the world the information is derived from.

The Meeting closed at 8.45pm.

Thanks to everyone who helped to make our show such a success. Congratulations to Carole Davis and Bob Southwell for their work as show marshals to organise the show and the plant display.
