# 6. <u>COMMITTEE</u>

At our committee meeting on 8<sup>th</sup> March the main discussion was about our April Show and the new growing competition. There are further details in this newsletter and there will be ore sais at the next meeting.

# 7. GROWING COMPETITION

The committee has decided that we will run a plant growing competition for the next twelve months (April,2016 to April,2017) using a plant called <u>Brassidium Tigerlily 'Tinone</u>e'. (This is a cross between <u>Brassia verrucosa</u> and <u>Oncidium sarcodes</u>)

These will be in 80mm pots and priced at \$10 (\$15 retail price).

Plants will be allocated at the monthly meeting on Thursday, 7<sup>th</sup> April.

If you would like to be part of this competition then please bring your money (\$10) and pay Bruce Hall before the start of the April meeting. We will have a draw during the meeting to allocate the plants.

The competition will function as follows:

- Members are asked to bring their competition plant to each monthly meeting for judging. Please leave in the tray near the entry door.
- Judges will be Ron Cowling plus the two rostered judges for that meeting.
- Points Score at each meeting

- 1 point for each plant brought to the meeting
- 2 extra points for the plant judged the best
- 1 extra point for the plant judged as second
- Results will be kept and collated by Ron Cowling and Dianne Blay.
- Each plant will be allocated a numbered tag (no names). If you repot the plant please make sure you include the numbered tag.
- Pick up your plant after the meeting.
- Prizes will be awarded at the end of the competition for:
  - Grower with most points
  - Plant which flowers first.

# 8. SOME GROWING TIPS for BRASSIDIUM

The following is a basic growing guide for the plant <u>Brassidium Tigerlily 'Tinonee'</u>.

#### Repotting:

- These plants were repotted into the 80mm pots just before Christmas, 2015.
- They may not require repotting until later in the year (Spring) depending on their rate of growth.
- When you repot them please transfer the name tag and the blue numbered tag into the new pot.
- They need a well-drained mix. Good quality bark (smaller grade) would be ideal for this purpose.
- Some perlite and small-sized stones (or scoria, gravel, etc) could be added to the mix. The potting

mix the plants are in contains coconut chips which will hold water. You could add fresh coconut chips to your new mix if you wish but too much may mean the mix will not dry out between each watering.

You may already have a fool-proof Oncidium/Brassia mix which you have found successful Please continue to use that mix and perhaps pass on your success story to the rest of us.

## Watering:

- Water regularly but allow the pot to partly dry out between each watering. Don't let the plant stand in water. The plants need frequent watering when in active growth (twice a week).
- The plants will require less water during the cooler months.

# Air Movement:

Good air movement is important for proper growth. Don't put plants too close together.

# Light:

Reasonably high light levels are needed (due to its Brassia parentage).

Dark green foliage indicates not enough light. Reddish or yellow/pale green foliage indicates too much light.

# Humidity:

Mid to high humidity levels (50 to 70%) needed especially when temperature is high.

You can increase humidity by damping down the greenhouse floor, turning on the misters/foggers

or sit the plant over a tray of moist gravel (not in the water). You only have to use the misters for 3 to 5 minutes to increase the humidity by 40 - 50% and reduces the temperature by around 5 degrees.

# Fertilising:

Best to use a complete fertiliser that promotes plant growth. This could be applied dry (slow release) or in a liquid form. Using a weak strength liquid fertiliser every week or two would be ideal. Most of you will already have a fertiliser program and will not need to make any changes.

If you are not certain which fertiliser to use, then one suggestion would be to mix up Focus Orchid Grow (higher nitrogen level) at 2mls per litre of water. Others are Campbells (Blue is the higher nitrogen version), Manutec Orchid Food, etc.

#### Pests and Diseases:

Keep an eye out for any problems and take the appropriate control/preventative method.

# 9. DICK COOPER'S TALK

Judging and Staking orchids

- Involved in judging since 1981
- OSNSW decided to add a new region for judging called Mid North Coast.
- Observed over the years that lots more varieties, colours etc of everything.
- All this has led to many and constant changes in the rule of judging.
- Many people manipulate their flowers by "ironing" the petals.
- For the last few years increasingly people are staking above the level the rules say is acceptable.
- Important because judges are looking for superior quality plants. Excessive manipulation and grooming should not be rewarded.
- Showed examples of correct and incorrect staking.
- No part of the flower is to be supported at all.
- No clips above the first branch.
- Clips are allowed but wire is preferable.
- Clips or ties should be unobtrusive.
- Judges are able to remove stakes and ties.
- <u>Key criteria for judges are</u>: Flower shape, Colour and texture, stem habit and arrangement.
- The whole plant should be in show condition free of disease and pests etc.
- If the flowers fall off during transportation don't throw them away put them with the plant in the front of the pot.
- Make sure you remove all the evidence of manipulation before entering the show.
