6. NEVILLE ANDERSON'S TALK

- Spoke about Psychopsis
- Bulbophyllums grow well in this area.
- Neville's turning point was when a man came to the door and asked about growing orchids. He had some under the tank stand in jam tins stuffed full of dirt.
- Keith Maxwell was a great scientist and was working with kingianums.
- Showed him where the kingianums were at Moonee.
- If grown on a rock grow it in bark and charcoal. If it grows on a tree tie it to a paper bark limb.
- 1960 CH Horticulture and Orchid Group met in CWA Hall
- Orchids split off and met in Presb. Hall because they had more numbers.
- Still grows natives and is especially interested in species.
- Mentioned many early growers and members of the early society who were free with help and advice.
- Spirited debates with father especially re the use of charcoal.
- Keith introduced fertilizer to orchids and began a move to bring scientists to orchid growers.
- 1981 Symposium first of its kind. Chinese scientist... "Confucius says Orchid grows in the valley and if not appreciated by man will wither and die."
- Natives in CH district.....100 different native orchids from Bellinger River to Clarence River.
- We have the biggest and the smallest orchids in the world.
- Dendrobium kingianum is the flower of the CHOS.
- In evolutionary terms kingianum is a new species from 2 extinct parents.
- The only kingianums that are perfumed are in CH district.

- Magnificent plant that has infinite variety.
- <u>Significant plants that we should grow</u>: D. moschatum, Coelogyne flaccida, L Anceps, Dendrochillum cobbianum, Zygopetalum mackayi, Paph insigne, Phalaenopsis lueddemanniana, D fimbriatum, Stanhopea negroviolacea, any Bulbophyllum, C Little Suzy.
