1.Cymbidium that won popular vote - it is a pure colour i.e. no red.

2. Coelogynes: *mooreana Brockhurst* and *Janine Banks* a hybrid of mooreana and flaccida registered by David Banks

3. Zygopetalum and problems with black spot.

Guest Speaker: Ed Pearce......Coelogynes.

- Grow well in Coffs Harbour
- Throughout Asia from sea level to 4000m. Coffs is intermediate so well suited.

Species

- 1. flaccida: cascading, from cream to caramel
- cristata: the Angel Orchid. In Himalayas 1700-2300m. Likes cooler climes.
- 3. mooreana: from Vietnam. Hardy plant.
- 4. speciosa: Indonesia-PNG up to 2000m.
- 5. fimbriata: Nepal, China, Malaysia. Very hardy small flowers.
- 6. tomentosa (massangeana) 1000-2000m
- 7. pandurata: greenish flowers from Borneo grows at sea level.
- 8. fragrans, lawrenceana, nitida, sanderiana, viscosa, usitana.

How to grow them

- Free draining mix
- Plenty of water in summer not as much in winter
- Hanging suits the flowering
- Moderate shade, good light and air.
- Don't like to be repotted too often. Pot on not from scratch.
- Weak fertilizer...little and often
- Insect resistant.
- Ed is going to try them on a frangipani

Hybrids

• 100 registered so far. A new field.

- Hybrids are mainly primary. There are now a few secondary hybrids.
- Experts: David Banks and Kevin Dawes
- C. Edward Pearce fragrans x mooreana
- C. Linda Buckley- cristata x mooreana
- C. Amber speciosa x ovalis
- C. Wilhelm Micholitz lawrenceana x mooreana
- C. Janine Banks mooreana x flaccida

There has been no intergeneric breeding yet

What next?

- New species
- Improved species line breeding?
- Expand colour palette
- Increase flower count
- Intensify fragrance
- Intergeneric crosses
- Tetraploids.

We need help to organise and run the Show and Ron Cowling will be organising a roster


9. TINONEE BUS TRIP

Don't forget to bring your competition plant for judging at the July Meeting. For those who feel they have lost the plant in among their collection, remember it has a yellow tag for identification.




