- Further information on the article from last months newsletter on growing new orchid plants from a leaf: Always works better if you dip the freshly cut end of the leaf in hormone gel or powder. Works well with Monopodial Orchids such as Phalaenopsis and Vandaceous type. Limited success reported when tried with Sympodial Orchids (those with a pseudobulb).
 - An analysis of Autumn Orchid Shows over the past seven years reveals that the number of growers contributing to the Show has decreased from 27 in 2018 to only 13 members in 2025. How do we account for this decrease when the overall Society membership has doubled during the same period? Are newer or less experienced members intimidated by the quality orchids of the more experienced growers? Perhaps the new computer entry system has proved daunting to some members and so they have decided the entry process is too complicated for them to navigate. Whatever the reason, it is a pity that this is the trend and an all out effort should be made to encourage all members to enter plants in both the monthly meeting competition and the two annual Shows held by CHOS. If you find the computer entry system is difficult then we have developed an alternative hand written method that you will find helpful. Talk to Paige before the next Show. Suggestions and feedback from members would be appreciated.



The district extends from the tablelands of the Great Dividing Range (over 900 metres from Dorrigo), down to the Pacific Ocean and Solitary Islands Marine Park.

As a consequence of the altitude variation, well over 250 Native Orchid species have been recorded growing naturally here.

These magnificent orchids have been captured in full bloom by none-other than our Orchid Society President, Nev Anderson, 200 of these superb orchids will be emblazoned across one wall of our magnificent venue for all to admire.

We are delighted this prestigious triennial event is being hosted in a regional centre.


Our Society looks forward to bringing the global orchid world together to participate; embrace competition; foster goodwill and camaraderie.


